Our every-member future

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

As we look forward to what God wants for us in our next 175 years, I have also been looking forward into the Lectionary for October. And I've been struck by a passage for Sunday, Oct. 23 -- Joel 2: 23-32. This was Peter's forward-looking preaching text on Pentecost in the book of Acts. Peter used this text to explain the positive future where Jesus – crucified and resurrected -- was taking his followers.

This has also been a meaningful text for my personal walk with God – where I had experienced destructive years of loss, based on my bad choices. But I believe this text also laid out a positive future for me -- where God leads -- as I learned to more obediently follow Jesus.

I also suspect this passage may also lay out a positive, productive future for First United Church of Christ of Galion. It has also recently had some lean years in attendance and impact.

Notice the progression from painful scarcity to abundance and then vision-rich, every-member ministry — which Peter preached about — in Joel 2: 25-28 (NRSV):

I will repay you for the years that the swarming locust has eaten, the hopper, the destroyer ... You shall eat in plenty and be satisfied, and praise the name of the LORD your God, who has dealt wondrously with you. And my people shall never again be put to shame. ... Then afterward I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions."

I have experienced some of this in my own life.

And I believe this is God's will for congregations willing to embrace vital, renewed, every-member ministry. God -- I believe this passage suggests -- wants to work with us to get past lean years of scarcity.

Jesus wants to work with us all, for new ministries of abundance and satisfaction.

This text concludes with every-member ministries, where every individual member of the church is somehow proclaiming and talking about the Good News of Jesus – not just the pastor. In the New Testament text, where Peter quotes Joel in Acts 2: 17, the word "prophesy" can just as well be translated "preach" or proclaim

In this vision-rich, spiritually expansive, future environment, all members of the church are involved in proclamation – even if just by their actions. Then all members of the church – female and male, young and old, poor and rich – are dreaming God's dreams for us and for our communities.

All members of the church are embracing a new vision from God: For a new and productive future from Jesus Christ. For another 175 years of spiritual abundance, where ministry that really matters is happening here.

All of this future would seem to be within these texts – Old Testament and New Testament. This could be all about us -- all of us, collectively and individually. So God's preferred intermediate future for us would seem to be about every member individually embracing serious discipleship, and serious vision, and serious ministry.

May this powerfully be so -- to the praise of our awesome God of the future. Amen.

From the Finance Committee:

This newsletter marks the end of the third quarter of 2022, and frankly, we are in a more somber financial state than the finance committee was expecting. Our general giving is lower than the last three years (\$96,700 average for the last three years down to \$86,700 this year), and our current fund reflects the decrease.

We have already tapped the reserve funds, with consistory approval, to help "keep the lights on." The finance committee will find a way to pay our bills through fund transfers, reallocation of resources, and expending reserves, but these solutions are only temporary. The budget for 2023 must and will show the realities of our current financial status.

On Sunday, in her historical presentation, Sandy Powell read the following from Rev. Burghalter's article in a 1901 Visitor. "Church loyalty, a proper pride, love of Christ and the spirit of genuine devotion to the best interests of yourself and your children should ... prompt you to lay money on the altar of the Lord liberally ... It's your church and your children's church after you."

We do thank you for your support and ask that, as you handle your time and finances, you continue to remember that we as a church can only succeed as we support each other and support our church both spiritually and with our gifts.

Heartland Conference of the United Church of Christ Fall Gathering

As your representative to the fall gathering, I was excited to be part of an in person gathering. The energy was real. The music, interruptions, walking from place to place, bumping into friends, and seeing the panic on speaker's faces just can't be felt on a zoom screen.

Rev. Joanna D'Agostino's opening worship could have been about Galion First. Lakewood Congregational has a beautiful old church with rooms galore and a maintenance budget to match. What it is lacking are people. Located in prime real estate they are exploring what she calls a ministry of physical space. Does this not sound like us? A ministry of physical space here in Galion?

The disaster relief team reported on our challenge of gathering 2022 buckets, kits, and care packages in the calendar year. We have already reached 1300, and in an exciting announcement the Disciples of Christ relief team is joining forces with us in this program. We are the only conference with a permanent location, Templed Hills, available 24/7 to drop off donations.

A report on S.A.R.A. gave us the exciting news that over \$107,000 has been donated for relief efforts in the Ukraine. S.A.R.A. has been in the Ukraine for over 35 years. See Doug for the video explaining where they are and what they do.

Outdoor Ministries reported that the new swimming pool has opened, over 300 campers attended this year (near pre covid days), accessible restrooms are being installed in the lodge as the last project in the Hills Are Alive campaign, and more to be announced.

Information was presented by United Church Homes, Back Bay Mission, recipients of Heartland's Make a Difference Grant, an outstanding workshop on inclusion (we're talking mental, emotional, and physical here), and more. There is just too much to cover in one short report.

And, of course, we did the mundane, as we passed a budget, discussed programming plans and office alignments, elected officers, and opened the floor for questions and input. The gathering was concluded with the moving installation of Rev. David Long-Higgins as the Heartland Conference Minister. He was elected during the covid meetings and installation was on hold until we met in person. -Douglas Court reporting
